Therefore, including awards or extracurricular activities that are strongly associated with private education—such as academic competitions, Olympiads, or activities conducted outside of school—may result in a disadvantage during the evaluation process.
- * Avoid including your name, school, or details about your family's socio-economic background—such as relatives' names, workplaces, or job titles—as this may negatively affect your evaluation.
